Dear Fellow Association Members,

A happy and prosperous New Year to all of you with, hopefully, peace in the world.

I am sure you all had a wonderful Festive Season celebrating Christmas with family and friends.

The last year had your Board kept busy with mainly the communication and motivation of the EGLE (Environment Great Lakes and Energy Dept.) authorities in Lansing to obtain permission for dredging. Finally, ***we obtained the permit and under the capable supervision of project chairperson Gerry Brown, Inlet # 2 and #3 were dredged and landscaped before the winter.*** Let us hope the grass will be growing in spring. We all are grateful for Gerry's seven-year leadership in getting most of the lake inlets navigable for the respective lot owners, thank you, Gerry.

We had a constructive Annual General Meeting and **two new Board members were voted for and then inducted by the Board: Sue Surducun was re-elected as Vice-President and Mark Rodemeyer as a new Director on the Board.** See our website www.lakebelair.org

It is interesting and very positive that **eleven new families have moved to the lake in 2025** and thus became new members. They were welcomed heartily by our chairperson, Vice-President Sue Surducun, who advised them on all lake issues and made them feel



appreciated to our lake community; thank you, Sue.

The Board's next objective is the dredging of Inlet#1, the main inlet from Beebe Creek, a large area which has developed into a silt

and sediment "muck" area since the construction of this lake in 1965. These sediments have been moving into the main body of the lake, have reduced its depth by more than half and are endangering the lakes sustained existence. This planned project, firstly, depends on the permitting by the EGLE authorities and, secondly, is a costly undertaking. For this, we will need the full support of the membership and every lot owner. We will keep you informed on next steps.

As allowed in our Bylaws, the Board decided to increase the annual membership fees by about five percent, for which you will receive invoices before end January. Please read the comments below of our secretary concerning your connection addresses.

Lastly, we still need volunteers to organize the Annual Fishing Tournament in June, so please, fishermen or others come forward and connect with a Board member.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to thank all of you for your support in the past and I wish you a good start of the year 2026,

Reminder of a very important issue, where we need cooperation from all LBAPOA Members/Lot owners:

EGLE has emphasized that "shoreline management work" needs to be implemented, **if we want them to grant permission for navigational dredging needs in future.** We would ask all of you to **consider** some of the following practical, environmental steps to carry out on your lots, in order to avoid the deterioration of shore lines and the spreading of detrimental organisms into the lake:

- Do not blow or rake leaves or debris into the lake. Control your lawn contractor!
- Consider emptying your septic system annually, if it is situated towards the lake. Thus, drain fields are not affected with overflows.
- Do not spray fertilizer or weed control chemicals near your shoreline.
- Plant native plants above existing seawall to avoid soil erosion.

Conclusions

- Minimum dissolved oxygen is adequate for good fish production.
- pH is within acceptable limits.
- Sample is somewhat nutrient (N and P) enriched. Adopt appropriate lakeshore landscaping and lawn care practices.
- No remedial action recommended at this time.
- REPEAT LakeCheck NEXT YEAR!

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- WARNING. condition requires immediate attention.
 - CAUTION. condition requires further evaluation.
 - OK. condition within acceptable limits.
 - NEUTRAL. condition neither good nor bad.
